The Position

As the **PLA Assessor – Contractor**, you will review and summarize the educational credentials, work experience, and supporting documentation submitted by internationally educated medical laboratory technologists (IEMLTs) and other non-traditionally educated applicants (e.g., BSc, MSc, and PhD) seeking to write the CAMLPR Field-of-Practice examinations. Using established standards, policies, and procedures, you will conduct the initial Prior Learning Assessment (PLA) review and prepare comprehensive assessment summaries that support the Credential Assessment Specialists in completing the final PLA report.

Key Responsibilities Include:

- Review and summarize the academic credentials, work experience, and professional certifications of internationally educated medical laboratory technologists (IEMLTs) and other non-traditionally educated applicants.
- Prepare clear, accurate assessment summaries in accordance with established standards, organizational policies, and regulatory requirements.
- Compare international educational qualifications to Canadian standards and document findings for review by the Credential Assessment Specialists.
- Identify missing, incomplete, or inconsistent information and communicate with applicants or appropriate organizations to obtain clarification or additional documentation.
- Maintain accurate, complete, and confidential assessment records and supporting documentation.
- Liaise with educational institutions, regulatory bodies, employers, and professional organizations to verify credentials and obtain supporting information.
- Participate in quality assurance activities to help ensure consistency, accuracy, and continuous improvement in the assessment process.
- Support internal and external audits by maintaining complete assessment documentation and providing information as required.

What Makes You the Ideal Candidate?

- A degree in business administration, communications, or a related field.
- Education and/or experience in Medical Laboratory Technology is required.
- A minimum of three years of experience in a related field.
- Registration as a Medical Laboratory Technologist (MLT) in good standing with a Canadian provincial regulatory body.
- Prior Learning Assessment Practitioner certification or experience in credential evaluation or prior learning assessment is preferred.
- Superior oral and written communication skills, combined with the ability to communicate complex information clearly and professionally.
- Solid knowledge of health professional regulatory frameworks, particularly registration pathways for regulated health professionals.
- Strong analytical skills, with the ability to review complex educational credentials and professional qualifications and prepare accurate assessment summaries.

- Highly organized and self-directed, with a proven ability to manage multiple priorities while maintaining confidentiality and professionalism.
- Exceptional attention to detail and accuracy in reviewing documentation and preparing assessment summaries.
- Proficient in Microsoft Office applications, including MS Teams and Zoom.
- Fluency in French, both written and verbal, is a strong asset.
- This fully remote role may require occasional evening or weekend work during peak assessment periods.
