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Purpose:

To ensure that all practicing registrants of the College understand their professional obligations by ensuring they receive education on jurisprudence related to the practice of Medical Laboratory Technology as part of the initial registration and/or renewal process with the College.

Definitions:

Jurisprudence - The study of the legislation (Act, Regulations, Bylaws) standards and code of ethics that govern the practice of a regulated health profession.

Policy:

Mandatory training on jurisprudence provides each new registrant with education on the legislation (Act, Regulations, Bylaws), standards of practice and code of ethics that govern the practice of Medical Laboratory Technology in Manitoba. Regularly scheduled refresher training ensures existing registrants are aware of their professional obligations under the Act.

- 1. All new applicants for registration with CMLTM in the Active: Practicing and Conditional categories will be required to successfully complete the following Jurisprudence eLearning modules prior to a certificate of practice being issued.
 - Manitoba Regulated Health Professions Act (RHPA) 101
 - Pause Before You Post: Social Media Awareness
 - Health Equity and Cultural Humility
 - Introduction to Indigenous Inclusion and Cultural Safety
- Any assigned jurisprudence eLearning modules will become a renewal requirement for all registrants in Active: Practicing and Conditional categories beginning during the 2019 renewal process.

- 3. All modules assigned, must be successfully completed before a certificate to practice will be issued.
- 4. Pass marks for all jurisprudence eLearning modules is 60%. New registrants and current practitioners must achieve the pass mark to be considered as completing a jurisprudence eLearning module.
- 5. All Active: Practicing registrants are required to complete the jurisprudence eLearning modules every five years or earlier as approved by the Council.
